1. TWO FREQUENTLY USED WORDS THAT MAKE US SUSPICIOUS: <u>UNLIMITED</u> AND <u>UNCONDITIONAL</u>.

"Now the chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that if anyone knew where he was, he should let them know, so that they might arrest him." (John 11:57)

The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" (John 12:12-13)

2. JESUS WOULD <u>FULFILL</u> GOD'S PROMISE TO ABRAHAM AND <u>REPLACE</u> GOD'S COVENANT WITH ISRAEL.

He went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers how he might betray him to them. And they were glad, and agreed to give him money. So he consented and sought an opportunity to betray him to them in the absence of a crowd. (Luke 22:4-6)

- 3. THE KINGDOM OF THIS WORLD WOULD TRY TO DEFEAT THE KINGDOM OF GOD.
 - A. THE PASSOVER MEAL WAS THE PERFECT OPPORTUNITY FOR JESUS.

And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of **me**." (Luke 22:19)

And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the **new covenant** in my blood." (Luke 22:20)
